I am delighted to commemorate my President's Night in the current Scottish Hall that we all know. Only a few Society members are unable to make the event for various reasons.


You will be joined by a number of guests and many members of my family.

The March equinox was MARCH 20th So Spring is here.!




Great photo taken this month in the Highlands of Scotland of the
