She's **steadily improving** and there is a possibility that eventually we will get her home with a care package, whether that would be in her flat we aren't sure. Positive news anyway.

"When I went in, Maisie was sitting in the lounge, talking with a nurse, having a cup of tea, and it was super to see that she recognised me immediately. She'd made such **incredible progress** since I last saw her just a few weeks ago. She was chatting about the Caledonian Society, recognised almost everybody in the photographs of recent Cally events, that I showed her, and she was interested in everything that's currently going on in the Society. Such an amazing difference from just a few months ago. She spoke so sensibly too, in that she said she would like to go home eventually, but realises she's not ready yet, and she would like to start dancing again one day, but, is understandably worried about falling and injuring her head again."

PS The following day she had treatment for her sore eye and it is looking much better
